### **Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal**

As many of you have heard, the Queen's 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary occurred on February 6<sup>th</sup> 2012. To mark this auspicious occasion a new medal was struck. This Diamond Jubilee Medal is a tangible way for Canada to honour Her Majesty for her service to this country. At the same time, it serves to honour significant contributions and achievements by Canadians.



During the yearlong celebration 60,000 Canadians will receive this medal. We are very pleased and proud to say that there will be celebrations in all the Regions of the HKVCA where our veterans and members will be honoured.

Our HK Veterans, members of C Force, fought in the defence of

Hong Kong in World War II against overwhelming odds, endured torture, starvation, disease, and slave labour to ensure that Canada remained free. Their return home was to continue to fight for support and benefits from their beloved country because of the lasting effects of the horrific treatment they received from the enemy.

As children and family members and friends of C Force we are extremely proud of the courage and sacrifices the men and women made on our behalf.

### ***Interview with John Lowe***

Lee, who is also our regional Education Chair, will be participating in the 2012 Peace & Reconciliation Study Tour for Educators. The group will be departing Vancouver on July 5 for Shanghai where they will spend 4 days visiting historical sights and Centers related to the Japanese invasion of China prior to and during WWII. They leave Shanghai for 4 days in Nanjing, 3 days in Harbin and 2 days in Seoul Korea.

From Seoul they will depart for 3 days in Hong Kong where they will visit St. Stephens School, Sai Wan War Cemetery, the Museum of Coastal Defense and other historical sights related to the story of 'C' Force. Lee departs Hong Kong with his fellow educators for the long flight back to Vancouver on July 21. We look forward to the many accounts Lee will have to share with us upon his return once he has rested up and we are grateful for his never ending commitment to education.

BC's Aldergove Star reported "Memorial Ride for Afghanistan's Fallen - In memory of the 158 Canadians killed in Afghanistan, there will again be a Memorial Ride for the Fallen this Saturday (June 9).

The Ubique Unit of the 3rd CAV, Canadian Army Veteran Motorcycle Units, are putting on the third annual 3 CAV Ubique Memorial Ride for the Fallen on June 9, from Vancouver to Chilliwack."

We also provide prizes which are awarded to the students who have created the best displays which depict veterans and their stories. Each year Michael places various Memoriams in the local newspaper to honour not only his dad but all Hong Kong veterans. Mike has also painted a huge HK logo on the side of a shed in his back yard, a bold tribute to all our veterans. Well done Michael!

Our Colour Party has been busy as usual and was in the March Past at the Decoration Day Parade at the Legislative Building on May 6. ### **Education Committee Report, Ontario Region – Pat Turcotte**

In the last issue of our National Newsletter, our Regional Director, Mike Babin, urged individuals across the province to step up their involvement in telling the Hong Kong story in various ways. We on the Committee would second that approach - that is, taking a proactive stance in increasing awareness in our communities of what our Hong Kong soldiers have contributed to the history of this country. The purchase of our three banners, as well as our other materials, could provide many opportunities to reach out to schools, service clubs and other organizations. Do consider being part of this outreach.

In Ontario, our typical involvements each year include presentations/displays at the Ontario History and Social Science Teachers' Association (OHASSTA) Conference, the Parliamentary Library Resource Fair in Ottawa, as well as Workshops in schools, and the yearly HKVCA Cross Canada Writing Contest. All of these events have an impact on those who take part, and we could be doing even more with increased numbers of our members participating in these activities.

In 2012, a very successful Workshop was presented in February in Toronto, with Sue MacDonell providing an exciting presentation, and Linda Guglick and Sandra Strom displaying the various publications we have to assist the teachers in increasing the time spent in the classroom on the Hong Kong story. We need even more HKVCA members willing to take the initiative in developing such workshops.

We also have two associations in particular that have goals related to ours in that they want to bring attention to the War in the Pacific, an area in WWII History that has been neglected in the past. The ALPHA organization (The Association for the Learning and Preserving of the History of WWII in Asia) is a very active group which has found many ways to interest the public in many important aspects of that historical period. We have been involved in their conferences, offering presentations in the recent past.

The judges are currently marking the papers which have come in during the last few weeks, and we now have nearly 60 students vying for the prizes offered in three categories, Junior

English (Grades 9 and 10), Junior French (Grades 9 and 10) and Senior English (Grades 11 and 12). Results will be made available on the HKVCA Website, and students receiving cash awards will receive their prizes by mail before the end of the school year. There are some wonderful pieces of writing, examples of which will be included on the Website as soon as we can make them available.

**From Ron McGuire**

I thought it was time I let readers know what I have been up to since Mitzi Ross took over the North-East Ontario Regional Representation from me. To begin, I would like to thank Mitzi for the fine job she is doing, which includes, along with Alan's important help, planning and organizing the special wreath laying at our Memorial Wall last December. It was the first of what is intended to be an annual event; to remember 7/8th December, the date of the infamous Japanese act of undeclared war on Hong Kong and throughout the Far East. Beginning this year, to avoid what could be inclement weather, it is planned for November, during what has become Canada's annual Remembrance Week. Mitzi and Alan must also be commended for arranging those wonderful luncheons followed by a 'show and tell' gathering at their lovely home. I was pleased to be able to provide some of the things that were 'shown'.

On 5 November 2011 I was invited to participate in a special RCAF event at the National Aviation Museum. I had six tables and several easels, one of each concerned "C" Force. The event was a great success and will be repeated annually. Because of my contacts I will be helping to organize it. I already have doubled the number of participants. The Museum also asked that I expand my coverage concerning Canadians at war in the Pacific, so it will be larger this year.

Derrill Henderson and I attend Ken Ewing's [RRC] funeral. Afterwards there was a very nice reception in the church hall. The home-made food is what only folks from Canada's rural areas can still prepare. Ken and Susan's children and family friends gave

their recollections of Ken. They were all interesting and well done, making it clear what a fine man, husband, father and friend Ken had been. It was my privilege to have known him.

On another sad note, Freddie Lalonde, my good friend and fine artist, also passed away in December. In 2001, at my request, Freddie did the life-like pen and ink sketch of Gander DM, which also depicted his brave acts. Fund raising prints are available from our web site. He was always pleased to hear the prints we made to sell were still popular. In the last few years I have authorized several authors to use the work to illustrate their books, which had chapters on Gander, but only on their promise of appropriate credit and reference to the HKVCA and our web site. Freddy was also happy to know his work was giving continued exposure to Gander and benefiting our cause as well.

Basically, I have been very busy doing things I have let 'slide' over the last three decades. Progress is being made, but of course, not as fast as Connie would like! Completing extensive articles for the postal history journals has taken much of my time. Many are on subjects I began researching 20 to 30 years ago and must be finished, before I am! They are on topics that are important to be recorded for posterity, of which I am quite knowledgeable. In the last two years, too many of Canada's prominent military postal historians have passed away, leaving me as one of few left to do it. Newcomers to the field tend to specialize in one or two subjects, so I leave those aspects for them to record.

I continue to do what I can on behalf of our veterans, including keeping in touch with the lads and ladies I know personally. The Nepean Museum's 'change in direction' prohibited me from repeating and updating my extensive 500 square foot plus exhibits of 2001 ["CO" Force---the 60th Anniversary of the Defence of Hong Kong] and 2005 [The 60th Anniversary of the end of WW II , "CO" Force and all Canadians involved with the

Pacific Campaign], for my 2011 Remembrance Month contribution. Many readers will have seen portions of my exhibits at our Reunions beginning in 1997. I was able to show the largest groupings at our 2005 and 2009 reunions in Ottawa. If all goes well, I will be in Winnipeg in 2013 with some of it for you to see. On the positive side, I did manage to convince the Museum management to have a small exhibit to commemorate the 70th Anniversary of the Defence of Hong Kong. It has a very prominent spot inside the entrance and cannot be missed.

### Manitoba Joins Other Provinces In Honouring Veterans

Press Release:

Premier Greg Selinger joined representatives of the Canadian Forces and the Royal Canadian Legion today to unveil Manitoba's Highway of Heroes between Winnipeg and Brandon that will permanently honour the contributions and sacrifices of Canada's military and veterans.

"For over 100 years, thousands of Manitobans have

served our country with unwavering commitment, dedication and bravery," said Selinger. "The designation of this highway is one way we honour their legacy and sacrifice, and recognize the pride and profound thanks of all Manitobans to the women and men of our Canadian Forces."

Highway markers located just west of Winnipeg and east of Brandon on the Trans-Canada Highway feature the iconic red poppy at the top and the Highway of Heroes name in both official languages with reflective white lettering on a blue background.

"On behalf of the Canadian Forces, I express our deep gratitude to the Province of Manitoba and indeed all Manitobans for what they are doing to honour and stand with the men and women who serve Canada," said Maj.-Gen. Alain Parent, commander of 1 Canadian Air Division, headquartered in Winnipeg. "Today is more than a designation of a highway sign; it is the dedication of ourselves that we, the living, shall not forget the ultimate sacrifice others have made in the service of Canada."

A simultaneous event was held in the Brandon area on the Trans-Canada Highway near Shilo, which included Drew Caldwell, MLA, Brandon East; Cliff Cullen, MLA, Spruce Woods; Brandon Mayor Shari Decter Hirst; and Lt.-Col. R.W.H. (Richard) Goodyear, commander of Canadian Forces Base, Shilo.

Approximately 425,000 Canadians served overseas in the First World War and over one million in the Second World War. Nearly 117,000 Canadians have died and over 225,000 have been wounded in all conflicts since Manitoba entered Confederation in 1870.
